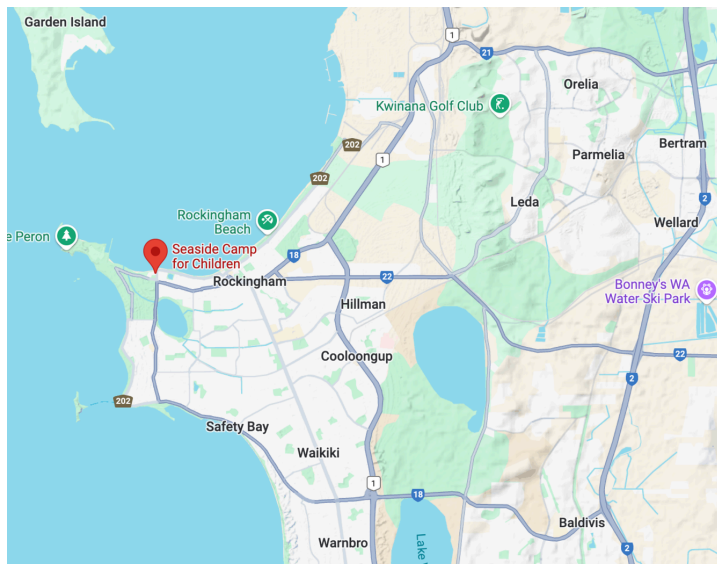
Departure

Accommodation arrangements: Your family will stay in your own allocated room, with a separate communal ablution block. We will meet and eat together in the dining hall, all our sessions are in the Meeting Room. It is a beautiful campsite by the beach with volleyball, grassed play areas, outdoor seating, and we will have provided activities as well. If you require more than one room please contact Pippa ASAP so that we can see what is available.

What to Bring

Its can get quite cold so bring warm stuff...

- Bedding – pillow, sheets, sleeping bag / doona . **Sheets & Pillow are a MUST.**
- Heaters will trip the power so **don't** bring them.
- Any medication you require
- Comfortable **warm modest*** casual clothing
- Toiletries & Bath Towel
- Enclosed walking shoes and slip on shoes to take off at the hall (no bare feet)
- Umbrella/raincoat
- A bag for your washing
- Wristwatch
- Hat
- Torch
- Drawstring bag or backpack – to carry around your stuff.
- A water bottle (with your name on it)
- A travel mug (with your name on it) if you like hot drinks during the day - optional
- Bible
- Picnic rug
- An outfit for our themed dinner. This years theme is 'in the Jungle'. Come dressed as a jungle creature or a character from Horton Hears a Who. Onesies are great!
- **A plain 100% cotton dark coloured shirt for our shirt bleaching activity.**
- A packet of biscuits/cake to share for morning tea. To be handed in to the kitchen upon arrival.
- Bring something cuddly to wear for the movie night (pjs, onesies, oodles, trackies, etc.)
- Adults only evening snacks
- Your own family first aid kit (we'll have one, but you know what you may need)
- Enthusiasm

Optional:

- Board Games
- Something musical if you like and if it fits
- Something sporty like a ball, bat, etc.
- Fishing gear, if you would like to go fishing during free time

And for the smaller campers among us you'll need portacots, high chairs and ten tons of other baby stuff.

What NOT to Bring

- Mobile Phones or Electronic devices
- Pocket knives, Cigarettes, vaping devices, drugs
- Expensive items

Personal Property

Please label all items of clothing and other property. Remember, the less you bring the less you have to pack at the end of camp, so only bring those items that are really necessary.

Worldview Australia and the camp leaders will not be held responsible for the loss of personal items.

No Distractions

WVA has a no distractions policy on camp, which is why you are asked to leave your electronic devices at home. As a part of this policy please do not book appointments during the week of camp. **You can't come and go from camp during the programmed activities**, it's a distraction to yourself and your family.

Camp Rules & Info

Familytime – it is especially important that adults and children participate together in this all-age activity each morning after breakfast. You will find it very enriching for your family relationships. Please be on time.

Technology – please leave ALL technology at home. Give your brain a true rest and relate to your family, other camp participants, explore the campsite and surrounding area. If a parent/adult needs a phone for emergencies or photos that is fine, but it is not to be used or seen in any other camp group setting. If you are seen on technology on camp you will be asked to put it away. We don't want to have to do that!

Showers – it is highly recommended that you shower either before breakfast or before dinner or during Free Time.

The Childrens Bed time is important to adhere to. Otherwise children become very tired and grumpy and parents miss out on important time together without kids and also become very tired and grumpy! If the older kids aren't ready to sleep it is recommended that they bring a book to read or game to play with siblings in their own cabin. A program for High schoolers & Young Adults is planned each evening, finishing by 10pm. High Schoolers 12yrs old (yr7+) are initially expected to participate with the adults in the evenings prior to the programmed activity (yr 7/8 at parents discretion) and go to bed around 9/930pm. Lights out for everyone by 1030pm.

Supervision – It is your responsibility to supervise your own children. Children are to remain seated during meal times (lunch & dinner) until everyone is finished. Children are **not** to move around with food. The Furniture in the Hall is not for Gymnastics or building cubbys, it is for sitting on.

The Hall – The Dining hall is for games, chatting, craft, organised camp activities, meals etc. The Meeting Room is for camp sessions, and is a quiet chill zone between activities and therefore is not the place to play, run around or jump on the furniture, unless the activity leader tells you to. Shoes, Loud Noise & Running must be left outside of both halls. There is plenty of space around the campsite for keeping active. There is also a small room off the large dining hall with couches for a cuppa and a chat :

Suggestions for afternoon activities: (you may need to bring some of your own gear)

Volleyball, craft, board games, songs/guitars , beach games, sandcastles, movie, beach walk, reading, sleeping, chatting, sports gear. Colouring in / puzzle options, games and some sports gear will be provided at the Dining Hall. You will also have the opportunity to make a camp T-shirt (or DIY other T-shirts, if you bring more than one!)
